## **Hunter Class Specifications**

The courses offered at this show will consist of at least eight fences with two changes of directions. The area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a mandatory line and will be indicated on the course diagram and designated by a physical barrier placed in the arena. Course diagrams will be posted at least one hour before the class. If entries warrant, a Junior division will be opened.

#### **Hunter Warm-Up**

Open to all exhibitors. The warm-up class will be open card, unlimited number of rounds, and will run for the duration of the day.

#### 2' Pleasure Hunter Hack

For Juniors and Amateurs. Horses will be shown at the walk, trot, and canter, then will be asked to individually jump two single fences. To be shown at 2' in height. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will not be jogged. Trotting jumps and simple changes of lead will not be penalized. Martingales are not permitted.

## **Junior/Amateur Cross Rail Hunters**

For Juniors and Amateurs. To be shown at 1'6" in height. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will not be jogged. Trotting jumps and simple changes of lead will not be penalized. Under Saddle class to be shown at the walk and trot only. Horse/Rider combination may not enter or show in any other class at this show with fences over 2'3".

For Juniors and Amateurs. To be shown at 2'6" or 3' in height. The course may include a halt, trot jump, hand gallop and/or other tests. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will not be jogged.

#### **Junior/Amateur 3' Hunters**

For Juniors and Amateurs. To be shown at 3' in height. To be judged on performance and soundness. Horses will not be jogged.

#### \$1,500 Hunter Derby

Open to all riders. To be shown at either 2'6" or 3'. Height must be indicated on the horse show entry form.

- a. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and course must offer a variety of Classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage;
- b. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are allowed;
- c. a minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers;
- d. Ground lines are not to exceed 18" on depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary;
- e. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of 8 feet wide on its front face;
- f. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
  - a. a minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round;
  - b. Fence height is 2'6" or 3'.
  - c. There must be four option fences set at 2'11" or 3'5", respectively.
  - d. At least one in and out.
  - e. At least one bending line.
  - f. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
  - g. At least one long approach.

#### Second Round: Handy Hunter Course

- a. a minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round;
- b. Fence height is 2'6" or 3'.
- c. There must be four option fences set at 2'11" or 3'5", respectively.
- d. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2' or 2'6" in height, respectively, halt, and or back.
- e. The top 20 horses from the First Round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for Second Round.

a. Horse will not be jogged.

## **Jumper Division**

In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. In ties other than first place, competitors will be classified by penalties and time in the initial course. If entries warrant, a Junior division will be opened.

#### **Jumper Tables**

Refer to time schedule. Management reserves the right to change tables in all jumper classes with adequate notice to exhibitors.

#### Orders of Go

If entries warrant orders of go will be drawn and posted one hour before the class.

## **Speed**

For all jumper classes the time allowed will be measured at 383 yards/minute (350 meters/minute)

## 0.70M (2'3") - 0.95M (3'1") Take Your Own Line

Open to Junior/Amateurs at 0.70M and all riders at 0.80M and 0.95M. Height must be indicated on the horse show entry form.

- a. In this competition the obstacles are to be jumped only once in the order chosen by the competitor. Any competitor who does not jump all the obstacles is eliminated.
- b. Competitors may cross the starting line and finishing line in either direction. These lines are to be provided with four flags; a red and a white flag at each end of the lines. Obstacles may be jumped in either direction, unless otherwise directed on the course plan. The jumps may or may not be flagged but if they are, they must have 4 flags, indicating the jump may be jumped in either direction. There are not to be any numbers.
- c. This competition is to take place without a pre-determined speed. There is no "time allowed" set for the round; there is a "time limit" of 120 seconds. If the competitor does not complete the course within the time limit he/she is to be eliminated.

d. If there is a refusal or run-out with a knock-down or displacement of the obstacle, the competitor may only restart his round when the obstacle knocked down or displaced has been replaced and when the Judge gives him the signal to start. He may then jump the obstacle of his choice. In this case 4 seconds for time correction will be added to the time of the round.

#### Scoring

a. TYOL rounds are to be judged and scored the same as all other rounds, i.e. all knockdowns, refusals and other disobediences are to be scored according to the table of penalties. The time taken is to be recorded. The clear rounds are to be "ranked" according to time taken, fastest being first. Bonus points in this round are to be awarded in the same manner as the Jump Off round (Art. 50A.5), i.e. the first ten rounds (by time elapsed) are to be given bonus points. The remaining clear rounds .3 bonus points are to be added to their scores. Rounds with jump penalties are not to be included in the bonus scoring. Disobediences are to be scored as the table of faults indicates.

#### **Showmanship**

Open to all riders. Horses will be asked to lead at the walk and trot in a straight line. Competitors will be judged on how well they exhibit the horse to the best of its advantage, with additional scoring for grooming and presentation of both horse and handler. The horse's soundness, muscling, and balance are noted as well as the ability of the handler to control the horse's body and mind.

#### **Hunter Suitability Showmanship**

Horses will be judged to determine their suitability in the hunter ring. 300

#### **Dressage Suitability Showmanship**

Horses will be judged to determine their suitability in the dressage ring. 301

#### **War Horse Showmanship**

Limited to horses with over 25 starts of greater than \$100,000 in earnings. 302

#### **Junior/Amateur Western Trail**

To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, jog, and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Maximum credit should be given to the Trail Horse that negotiates its way through the entire course efficiently in a timely manner, without excessive hesitation, with curiosity, expression, smoothness and style; it should show in a manner that leaves on with the impression of being sure, safe, and a pleasurable ride over a course of obstacles. A horse/rider combination may show in either (TIP) Western Pleasure Walk/Jog or (TIP) Western Pleasure Walk/Jog/Lope, but not both. One flat class and the Trail Class will determine Western Pleasure/Trail champion.

#### **Dollar Bill Class**

#### **Horse Identification**

The Thoroughbred Classic Horse Shows are only open to Thoroughbreds. It is our goal to be as inclusive as possible. If you have any questions, please email **info@thoroughbredclassic.org.** 

- a. To compete in the **Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) classes**, a horse must have one of the following criteria met.
  - The Jockey Club Certificate of Foal Registration (or similar document from a foreign stud book) or a copy thereof; OR
  - The horse's lip tattoo, the horse's 5-cross pedigree and the successful tattoo lookup result from The Jockey Club's Tattoo Identification Services, (registry.jockeyclub.com); OR
  - A letter from The Jockey Club verifying the horse's identity. For a small fee, the Jockey Club can DNA type any horse born after 2001.

A TIP number must be obtained by going to <a href="www.tjctip.com">www.tjctip.com</a> > T.I.P. Number. A TIP number must be obtained for each horse/rider combination.

- b. To compete in **non-T.I.P. classes/awards**, a horse must meet one of the above criteria. If it is not possible to provide a tattoo number or Jockey Club paper, you must submit the following information to <a href="mailto:info@thoroughbredclassic.org">info@thoroughbredclassic.org</a>:
  - o The Jockey Club Registered Sire's Name of your Thoroughbred, and/or;
  - o Name of private breeder or Farm where horse was obtained, and/or;
  - The name of the Aftercare Organization that you adopted your horse from.

Once information is submitted, the horse's identity will be confirmed and the show committee will provide you with eligibility status.

At the discretion of management, a horse's identification will be verified by reading lip tattoos and/or reviewing identifying paperwork. Any horse that is identified as not said horse would immediately be disqualified; prior prizes revoked, and will forfeit all fees. If there was simply an error in identification, final decision is up to show management.

### **Dogs**

All dogs must either be crated or on a leash. No loose dogs/pets allowed anywhere on the premises. Loose dogs will incur a \$100 fine. You must clean-up after your pet.

## **Liability Release**

Every horse and rider must have a signed liability release on file in the horse show office prior to riding his or her horse. This includes schooling.

## **Add/Scratch Fees**

Classes added after the horse's number is picked up will incur an additional \$5/class. A scratch fee will not be charged if exhibitor withdraws from class prior to the start of said class, with the exception for the Hunter Derby, Jumper Stakes, and Dressage Challenge. The Dressage Challenge class must be registered for prior to the horse's first test.

a. To be considered properly made and not subject to additional fees, class adds and scratches must be made on proper paperwork in the show office prior to the start of the class. If an exhibitor rides in, but does not properly enter a class, a RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter) fee of \$10 plus the late class entry fee will be charged. It is not sufficient to inform the gate personnel of adds and scratches, unless an Add/Scratch form is completed in the office, additional charges will apply.

#### **Ribbon Presentation/Prizes**

Ribbons will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> place. A prize will be given in addition to the 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbon. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be presented for each division. Horses and riders will be asked to return to the ring for award presentations with our sponsors after each class and for Champion and Reserve Champion Awards at the completion of each division.

#### Clinics

Clinics will be offered to exhibitors on Friday, April 19th. Being offered will include a dressage, Hunter/Jumper, and Horsemanship (both groundwork & undersaddle).

Please refer to premium for more specific clinic information. Register two weeks prior to clinic date to avoid a \$15 late fee.

#### Schooling

No horse may school without a number being clearly displayed at all times. Schooling in the show rings will be available Friday around the clinic schedule. To ensure everyone's safety, no more than eight horses will be allowed to school in the show rings at any given time. The Olympic Arena will be open from 7am – 5pm for schooling. All arenas will be closed by 5pm on Friday. Schooling in show arenas is permitted from 7:00-7:45 on Saturday and Sunday. All horses showing over fences will be assessed a \$25 warm up fee. Longeing in designated areas.

#### Management

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, arising from, or incident to the show without claims for damage or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final. The Management reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel and award prizes without claim for damages: to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, to change or rotate judges, to change specifications in classes to facilitate the time schedule. Shall a protest be raised; show committee at the conclusion of the class will hear the protest.

#### Conflicts

Riders with conflicts (classes, rings, trainers, etc.) are responsible and must arrange their order of go with the gate official so they will not hold up the class. If this has not been done at the start of any class, the rider may be considered to have scratched. Starters may scratch riders without consultation with Show Management.

#### CDS

If the competitor and/or owner is not a member of CDS, then the show management will charge and collect \$15 non-member fee for CDS.

Every class offered here in which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

#### **Dressage Entries - Ride Times**

Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis and must include all fees, membership and horse registration proofs, signatures and payment. Numbers will not be released until this process is complete; entries without payment in full may be returned. Withdrawing at any time will not excuse the responsible party from paying all of the applicable fees. Those who do not comply with this will be turned in to the recognizing authorities and no future entries will be accepted until the matter has been resolved. USEF & USDF cards may be printed on one sheet of paper using the website www.eqverification.org. All incomplete entries may be charged a \$10

internet fee to cover time and supplies to verify memberships.

Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judges, riders and management. Rider scheduling preferences, if noted on the entry form will be indulged when possible. The 50 minutes between rides rule will be observed for riders of multiple horses. Requests for specific break parameters and/or ride times will be considered, but not guaranteed. Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty.

## **CDS Membership Cards**

Copies of all membership cards are required. To enter the Adult Amateur division, the USEF membership card MUST indicate Amateur status and the individual must have reached the age of 22 in the current year. JR/YR classes are open to riders under 21 years of age as of the previous year. Open classes are open to all. All incomplete entries will be charged a \$10 internet fee to cover time and supplies to verify memberships. If you do not submit proof of Adult Amateur status, you will be entered in the Open division. If you request to switch to Adult Amateur classes after scheduling, all post entry and/or change fees will be applied.

## **Non-Negotiable Checks**

There will be a penalty of \$25 plus bank fees for entries paid by a check that is returned by the bank for any reason. New payment must be made, including penalties, by money order, cashier's check or cash within 14 days of notification or the matter will be turned over to CARMA and/or the District Attorney.

## **Stalls and Shavings**

Stalls and Shavings may be reserved by calling Claudia Berglund at 714.401.9510. Stall reservations are non-refundable. Please call Claudia as early as possible to let her know how many stalls and tack rooms you will need. Shavings orders are not refundable.

#### Manure

Manure must be placed in designated areas. Trash must be separated from manure. Each violation will result in \$100 fine.

#### Feed

Depending on Blenheim's supply, limited feed options will be available. Please provide your own feed.

#### **Grounds Fee**

There will be a \$50 per day fee grounds fee for horses trailering in and out and not renting a stall.

#### RV

\$75/day. This fee does not include pump outs. Pump outs are available for an additional fee. RVs must be parked in their assigned space.

#### **Medical Waste**

Sharps must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine.

## **Parking**

All vehicles must be parked in designated areas. Access roads adjacent to the barns are for loading and unloading only! Unauthorized vehicles in non-designated parking areas or permit only parking areas are subject to tow at owner's expense.

#### **Show Office Hours**

The show office will be open Friday from 8am-6pm and Saturday/Sunday from 7am- one hour after the conclusion of the last class.



T.I.P. offers sponsorship for Thoroughbred-only classes and divisions, high point Thoroughbred awards at open horse shows and competitions, a Thoroughbred of the Year Award and a Young Rider of the Year Award.

For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. In order to participate in a T.I.P. class or be eligible for a T.I.P. award, owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. T.I.P. Numbers are free and should be obtained for each horse/rider combination. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

Number.
